# Question 7 What does the law of God require?



# The 2nd Commandment Narrowly



Exodus 20:4-6 | You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments.

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Does God prohibit all making of images?

Does God prohibit displaying images in a place of worship?



#### **Tabernacle**

Exodus 25:18 | And you shall make two cherubim of gold; of hammered work shall you make them, on the two ends of the mercy seat.

#### <u>Temple</u>

1 Kings 6:18 | The cedar within the house was carved in the form of gourds and open flowers.



So if the Second Commandment does not prohibit making images... and it also does not prohibit displaying images in a place of worship...

What does it prohibit?



Exodus 20:4-6 You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments.

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The Second Commandment prohibits making images <u>for</u> the <u>purpose of</u> bowing down to them and serving them.



**Isaiah 44:14, 16-17** He cuts down cedars... Half of it he burns in the fire. Over the half he eats meat; he roasts it and is satisfied. Also he warms himself and says, "Aha, I am warm, I have seen the fire!" And the rest of it he makes into a god, his idol, and falls down to it and worships it. He prays to it and says, "Deliver me, for you are my god!"

Idolatry is folly.



Psalm 115:4-8 | Their idols are silver and gold, the work of human hands. They have mouths, but do not speak; eyes, but do not see. They have ears, but do not hear; noses, but do not smell. They have hands, but do not feel; feet, but do not walk; and they do not make a sound in their throat. Those who make them become like them; so do all who trust in them.

Idols make us less human, less alive.



"What is an idol? It is anything more important to you than God... anything so central and essential to your life that, should you lose it, your life would feel hardly worth living... It can be family and children, or career and making money, or achievement and critical acclaim, or saving 'face' and social standing. It can be a romantic relationship, peer apporval, competence and skill, secure and comfortable circumstances, your beauty or your brains, a great political or social cause, your morality and virtue, or even success in the Christian

What about bowing down or serving images meant to represent the true God?



Exodus 32:1-6 | "When the people saw that Moses delayed to come down from the mountain, the people gathered themselves together to Aaron and said to him, "Up, make us **gods** who shall go before us. As for this Moses, the man who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him." So Aaron said to them, "Take off the rings of gold that are in the ears of your wives, your sons, and your daughters, and bring them to me." So all the people took off the rings of gold that were in their ears and brought them to Aaron. And he received the gold from their hand and fashioned it with a graving tool and made **a** golden calf. And they said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" When Aaron saw this, he built an altar before it. And Aaron made a proclamation and said, "Tomorrow shall be a feast to the LORD." And they rose up early the next day and offered burnt offerings and brought peace offerings.



#### Why not?

- Earthly things used to represent the supernatural become objects of worship themselves
- God is living images are dead
- We worship creator, not created things
- Humanity is 'in the image of God' images are lesser
- God chose to reveal himself by word rather than visibly, until the word became flesh (Jesus) who is now in heaven




What about images meant to represent the true God, generally?




**WLC 109** | The sins forbidden in the second commandment are... the making any representation of God, of all, or of any of the three Persons, either inwardly in our mind, or outwardly in any kind of image or likeness of any creature whatsoever...



"I affirm that images are not to be made and used to worship, not even to worship God. However, I take exception to Westminster Larger Catechism Q. 109 when it says one should not make "any representation of God, of all or of any of the three persons, either inwardly in our mind or outwardly in any kind of image or likeness of any creature whatsoever." This seems to press the command further than Scripture does. There are some instances where it seems clear that biblical texts want the reader to picture something about God. For example, the Lord shows Moses his glory in Exodus 33 and the Spirit of God descends "like a dove" and settles on Jesus in Matthew 3. The most obvious example, of course, is Jesus Christ who is "the image of the invisible God" (Colossians 1:15). Scripture portrays Jesus, the son of God and second person of the Trinity, in his human likeness in such a way that one cannot help but picture him in our minds. For example, Thomas touching his hands and side in John 20. Therefore, I think that in some wise instances, such as children's Sunday school lessons or evangelistic films depicting the life of Christ, so long as such images are not being worshiped, we may create an image of God that is consistent with the images Scripture creates of God."

# The 2nd Commandment Broadly



WLC 108 | The duties required in the second commandment are, the receiving, observing, and keeping pure and entire, all such religious worship and ordinances as God hath instituted in his Word; particularly prayer and thanksgiving in the name of Christ; the reading, preaching, and hearing of the Word; the administration and receiving of the sacraments; church government and discipline; the ministry and maintenance thereof...

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WLC 109 | The sins forbidden in the second commandment are, all devising, counselling, commanding, using, and anywise approving, any religious worship not instituted by God himself... all superstitious devices, corrupting the worship of God, adding to it, or taking from it, whether invented and taken up of ourselves, or received by tradition from others, though under the title of antiquity, custom, devotion, good intent, or any other pretence whatsoever; simony; sacrilege; all neglect, contempt, hindering, and opposing the worship and ordinances which God hath appointed. ### Overarching Principle of the Second Commandment:

Worship God in God's ways



**Leviticus 10:1-2** Now Nadab and Abihu, the sons of Aaron, each took his censer and put fire in it and laid incense on it and **offered unauthorized fire** before the Lord, which he had not commanded them. And fire came out from before the Lord and consumed them, and they died before the Lord.



2 Samuel 6:5-7 | And David and all the house of Israel were celebrating before the Lord, with songs and lyres and harps and tambourines and castanets and cymbals. And when they came to the threshing floor of Nacon, Uzzah put out his hand to the ark of God and took hold of it, for the oxen stumbled. And the anger of the Lord was kindled against Uzzah, and God struck him down there because of his error, and he died there beside the ark of God.

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### Overarching Principle of the Second Commandment:

Worship God in God's ways



#### **Moral Law**

Relates to God and his character, love for God and neighbor, what is righteous and unrighteous, holy and unholy. Still applies.

#### **Ceremonial Law**

Relates to tabernacle and temple worship, offerings and sacrifices, ritual cleanliness and purity. Does not apply today - Christ has fulfilled!

#### **Civil Law**

Relates to OT Israel as nation-state with civil sanctions and penalties for violating the law. Does not apply today - Gospel going to all nations!



#### **2nd Commandment**

#### **Moral Law**

Do not make an images for the purpose of worshiping God, Worship God in God's ways.

#### **Ceremonial Law**

Do not offer unauthorized incense, do not touch the holy things (like the ark of the Covenant)

#### **Civil Law**

Penalty of death if you offer unauthorized incense or touch the holy things.



#### How We Worship at Canyon Creek - Isaiah 6:1-7

**Tithes and Offerings | 1 Corinthians 6:2 |** On the first day of every week, each of you is to **put something aside** and store it up, as he may prosper.

Benediction | Numbers 6:22-27 | The Lord spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to Aaron and his sons, saying, <u>Thus you shall bless the people</u> of Israel: you shall say to them, 'The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.' So shall they <u>put my name upon the people of Israel, and I</u> will bless them."

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#### Loving God through the 2nd Commandment

#### **Action**

**Negative**: Do not make images for the purpose of bowing down and serving them, not even to worship the true God.

Positive: Worship God in the ways God commands

#### Allegiance:

Worship is Covenant Renewal. Worship God how he asks to be worshiped - just because it's him who asked.

#### **Affection:**

God is worthy of our praise. And it's good we don't need a carved image to access him. He's invisible and omnipresent.



Matthew 28:20 | And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.
