"He Is Still That God!" from the channel Oasis of Hope Chicago is a sermon/testimony focused on the unwavering, unchanging nature of God, contrasting it with human attempts to redefine sin and God's standards.

Here is a detailed summary of the main points:

God's Unchanging Nature and Standards

- **God's Consistency:** The central message, inspired by the speaker's personal study, is that "God is still that God" [13:31]. The speaker emphasizes that God is "the same yesterday, today" [10:14], rejecting the modern notion that "God is doing a new thing" or now "accepts" people in their sin [09:50].
- Sin is Still Sin: God's hatred for sin has not changed since Genesis and will not change through Revelation [10:35]. The speaker cites an instance where a person was upset about cursing being labeled a sin, reinforcing that profanity is a sin [10:52].
- Laws and Consequences: God established laws, promising blessings for obedience and curses for disobedience, and "I'm still that God" in enforcing those consequences [20:37]. God's laws are not based on earthly politics or human opinion [21:05].
- **Rejection of Worldly Change:** The world has changed with technology, but God has not [14:05]. The speaker warns against adhering to any "law of man that goes against righteousness" and God's right standing [21:37].
- **Titles Don't Matter:** Titles and worldly achievements (like a doctorate) mean nothing to God [15:21]. The speaker recalls a story about a "reverend doctor" being told that "titles mean nothing to God" when being urged to repent [15:33]. Paul, despite his learning as a chief Pharisee, counted it as nothing after meeting Christ [16:34].

Evidence of God's Power and Love

- Mercy and Covenant: God is a merciful God [25:52] and promises to not forsake or destroy those who obey him, nor forget the covenant made with their fathers [26:10].
 This promise encourages the audience to take a stand for God's word and not live in fear, even of things like plagues, if they walk uprightly [37:00].
- **Divine Defense:** God defends his people, as shown when the Assyrian king boasted against Israel's God, leading to God sending an angel to slaughter 185,000 soldiers [31:16]. God does not tolerate disrespect from those who call him "worthless" [32:00].
- Blessing the Faithful: God honors the promises made to the faithful, citing examples of how the "seed" (children and descendants) of faithful church members are blessed and doing well financially [49:51].
- **Personal Testimony of Healing:** A previous speaker begins the sermon by sharing a personal testimony of an intensely swollen foot being instantly healed, describing the fluid "purging" on the kitchen floor after praying and asking God to "straighten this out" [00:00].
- **Testimony of a Patient:** The speaker recalls visiting a nursing home and witnessing an 80-year-old Spanish-speaking woman, who was initially admitted with dementia, testify

to being healed: "I don't have dementia no more... Jesus did it for me" [40:04].

Warnings and Encouragement

- The Danger of "Idle Words": The speaker discusses the biblical concept of being judged for every "idle word" [28:58], giving the example of a homeless person saying "God bless you" while not truly serving or seeking God—those words are "idle" if they die in their sins [29:10].
- Work Out Your Own Salvation: The audience is encouraged to "work your work out your own salvation" [24:41] and focus on their own spiritual walk rather than judging others [25:10].
- **Rejecting Modern Inclusiveness:** The speaker strongly criticizes the modern "all-inclusive" movement that tries to bring sin into the church, comparing the spirits behind this movement to "a dog on zoo" [22:48]. He specifically denounces the acceptance of "trans" identities in leadership roles in the church [44:27].

The overall theme of the video is that while human cultures and laws may shift, God's nature, hatred of sin, and promises to the righteous remain **unchanged**.
