## **RESPONSE QUESTIONS**

- 1. What is Paul's main point in this passage?
- 2. Hopefully there are those in your life who you admire and who provide a good example for you to follow, but how much do you think about the influence you can have on those who are younger than you?
- 3. Wolves can be a hazard in the church. Paul repeatedly warns
  Timothy against this problem. What is the difference between a
  wolf and people you simply may disagree with on an issue? What
  is the biggest problem caused by wolves?
- 4. We are to avoid wolves (vs. 5). What are some practical ways to do this?
- 5. How are we to identify wolves? Is it possible to be overly preoccupied with the identification of wolves? What is the problem with this?
- 6. In verse 6 women are shown to be at risk. How should we as men think about this?
- 7. In vss. 10-13 Paul encourages Timothy to follow him. Why is this not arrogant on Paul's part, and what are healthy vs. unhealthy ways to look to others to follow?
- 8. In the sermon, pastor Aaron talked about how people look to their favourite pastor at another church for leadership more than the one at their own church. How can this be a problem?
