Personal Reflection

Take time this week to pray & reflect on the following:

Countless metaphors and illustrations have been posited through history to describe the local church—a family, a faith-community, a fellowship, etc. No single term fully captures the mystery, beauty and priceless value of the local church. Much more than a building or an organization that bears a name and a logo, the local church is one part of a vast, history-spanning force for the furtherance of God's will in the world.

When the local church is strong, working together in unity and willed with the Holy Spirit's power, it is unstoppable. A strong local church is active, alive and invigorated by the urgency of the Gospel. Weak and dysfunctional churches exist because their members either don't know or don't love Jesus. What is your role in the work of the church? What sacrifice are you making to contribute to its strength? Prayerfully express your thanksgiving to God for commissioning and leading His Church. Ask Him to give you a clear sense of your unique abilities and gifts and of your role in the work of this local church.
