Personal Reflection

Set aside fifteen minutes this week to pray & respond to the following:

Consider for a moment, the myriad of choices that you have consciously & unconsciously made today. The clothes you put on this morning, what you had for breakfast, how long you brushed your teeth afterwards, etc.. Choices are such a natural & frequent part of life that we often fail to consider their lasting impact.

Worshiping is a choice & Christians are empowered by the Holy Spirit to commune with God through this sacred & timeless act. The Lord has enabled & commanded us to partake in both private & public worship with our fellow believers.

Being a Christian does not automatically make one a worshipper. Attending a religious service is not the same thing as participating in worship. We must choose to worship God & He has called us to do it in spirit & in truth.

Worship is the act of expressing the deepest human devotion. Being a worshipper means to prioritize Christ above all other loves & to demonstrate that love through prayer, music, study of God's Word, giving, sacrifice, etc.. At the very the heart of worship is love—love for God because He first loved us.
