

Dream Again — Part 4: Details of the Dream

Faith is built in the details of the dream.

(Genesis 41:15-16 NLT) “Then Pharaoh said to Joseph, “I had a dream last night, and no one can tell me what it means. But I have heard that when you hear about a dream you can interpret it.” “It is beyond my power to do this,” Joseph replied. “But God can tell you what it means and set you at ease.”

(Genesis 41:25 NLT) “Joseph responded, “Both of Pharaoh’s dreams mean the same thing. God is telling Pharaoh in advance what he is about to do.”

(Genesis 41:29-30 NLT) “The next seven years will be a period of great prosperity throughout the land of Egypt. But afterward there will be seven years of famine so great that all the prosperity will be forgotten in Egypt. Famine will destroy the land.”

(Genesis 41:47-49 NLT) “As predicted, for seven years the land produced bumper crops. During those years, Joseph gathered all the crops grown in Egypt and stored the grain from the surrounding fields in the cities. He piled up huge amounts of grain like sand on the seashore. Finally, he stopped keeping records because there was too much to measure.”

Bring your best and trust God with the rest.

(Luke 6:38 NLT) “Give, and you will receive. Your gift will return to you in full—pressed down, shaken together to make room for more, running over, and poured into your lap. The amount you give will determine the amount you get back.”

Die to the dream so God can do it better.

Find your rhythm in the details.

(Galatians 6:9 NKJV) “And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart.”

Praise God even if the dream looks different.
