Do Americans believe in God?

- I don't believe in God (7%)
- I don't know whether there is a God and I don't believe there is any way to find out (7%)
- I don't believe in a personal God, but I do believe in a Higher Power of some kind (14%)
- I find myself believing in God some of the time, but not at others (6%)
- While I have doubts, I feel that I do believe in God (16%)
- I know God really exists and I have no doubts about it (50%)



Who is God?

- Half of the world's faiths do not believe in a single deity
- Monotheism is the belief that God is the only deity, and that the world is a separate reality in which God intervenes, often through supernatural means
 - The five largest monotheistic religions are Zoroastrianism, Christianity, Islam, Judaism, and Baha'l
 - Is the God of Judaism, Islam, and Christianity the same God?

The Order of the Universe

- "The order of the universe is not an assumption: it is an observed fact." ~ Carl Sagan
 - Cosmos the universe seen as a wellordered whole
 - Greek root kosmos "to order and arrange, to set in array;" also "to establish"



The Trinity

The one God manifested in three equal and distinct forms is set apart from the God of the other two Abrahamic faiths (Judaism and Islam)

- The Father
 - "Creator, Lord of the history of salvation, Father, and Judge, as revealed in the Old Testament"
- The Son
 - "The Lord who, in the incarnated figure of Jesus Christ, lived among human beings and was present in their midst as the 'Resurrected One'"
- The Holy Spirit
 - _"The helper or intercessor in the power of the new life"



The Trinity

- The word "trinity" and the doctrine of the triune God do not explicitly appear in the Bible
- It was not the intention of early Christians to contradict the revelation of God as as singular and unique
- They wrestled with:
 - · Jesus' claims of who He is
 - The power of God within them (The Holy Spirit)

Jesus Equates Himself to God

- God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.' " (Exodus 3:14)
- Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I am." (John 8:58)

"He eternally exists in three persons: ..."

- "...the Father, the Son, & the Holy Spirit."
- The essence of God is reflected in three distinct persons
- They existed in unity before time began, and are forever in unity

Did God Abandon Jesus on the Cross?

- Matthew 27:46; Mark 15:34
 - Psalm 22
- Once saved, sin cannot separate us from God
- The unity of the Trinity cannot be broken by sin
- If God cannot look upon sin, what was Jesus doing during His ministry?




How do I respond to God?

- Be careful not to limit God to your way of thinking and being He doesn't answer to your agenda, but you must answer to His
- Be grateful for how deeply God loves you and desires to be with you, no matter what
- · Be curious and seek to know as much about God as possible
- Be content with not knowing or understanding everything God is doing in the world or in your life
- Be certain that God knows what He's doing, and you don't have to help Him unless He asks for it
