- 2. How do you respond to the statement: *Persecution is inevitable for those whose faith is public*?

- 3. In what sense are Christians made into *strangers* in the world because of their faith in Jesus?
- 4. Why is persecution a natural part of a Christian's life?
 - a. How does this *realization* change the way you respond to persecution?
 - b. Do you think persecution is a privilege for Christians? Why or why not?

<u>Remember</u> that persecution is <u>proof</u> of our connection to Jesus.

- 5. Why do you think Jesus spent a significant portion of his farewell speech talking to his followers about persecution?
- 6. Consider Matthew 19:29. What long term promises can you cling to when you face persecution in your life?
- 7. Consider Romans 14:21-23. Why is faith an essential element to defeating sin's power in your life?

<u>Reveal</u> your faith, <u>trusting</u> in the power of the Holy Spirit.

- 8. Why is faith an essential element in revealing the truth of the gospel to the world?
- 9. How is it that we work with the Holy Spirit in revealing the truth about Jesus?
- 10. In what ways are you looking to the world for love that is cannot provide?
- 11. What is one step you can take this week to grow in faith that will help you cooperate with the Holy Spirit's desire to reveal the gospel through you?
