



5-Day Devotional: As You Go

Day 1: Faith the Size of a Mustard Seed

Reading: Luke 17:1-6; Ephesians 3:14-21

Devotional: When the disciples asked Jesus to increase their faith, His response was surprising: you already have enough. Faith isn't about supersized confidence or perfect readiness—it's about trusting God's power working through you. The Holy Spirit grants what you need as you step forward in obedience. You don't need to wait until you feel completely prepared or spiritually mature. God sees your journey from beginning to end, and He's already equipped you with what matters most: His presence and His Spirit. Today, stop measuring your readiness by human standards. Instead, ask: Am I willing to obey? That small seed of willingness is enough for God to move mountains in and through your life.

Day 2: Healed As You Go

Reading: Luke 17:11-19; 2 Kings 5:1-14

Devotional: The ten lepers weren't healed standing before Jesus—they were healed as they went. Obedience preceded the miracle. This challenges our desire for immediate results and instant transformation.

Sometimes God calls us to move before we see the change, to step out while still carrying our struggle. This isn't cruelty; it's an invitation to deeper faith. Like Naaman who had to dip in the Jordan seven times, breakthrough often comes through faithful obedience, not perfect circumstances. What has God told you to do that you've delayed because you don't yet see the outcome? Your healing, your breakthrough, your transformation may be waiting on the other side of your obedience. Trust Him enough to go.

Day 3: Formed by the Spirit, Not Human Assessment

Reading: Galatians 4:19-20; 1 Corinthians 3:1-9

Devotional: The formation of Christ in you is the Holy Spirit's work, not the result of human approval or mentorship. While godly guidance matters, no person can grant you what only God can give: boldness, anointing, and spiritual authority. Paul agonized when believers regressed into legalism—waiting for human permission instead of walking in Spirit-given freedom. Are you waiting for someone to declare you "ready"? The woman at the well didn't attend seminary before sharing her testimony. Lydia didn't wait years before opening her home to ministry. They encountered Jesus and immediately responded. Stop allowing others' assessments to silence what God has placed in your heart. His approval is sufficient. His Spirit is your qualifier.

Day 4: Going in His Name

Reading: Matthew 28:16-20; Acts 1:4-8

Devotional: Jesus' final command was clear: "Go and make disciples." But notice—He didn't send them alone. He promised His presence and His Spirit. Going in His name means going with His authority, His power, and His guidance. It's not about your eloquence, your credentials, or your perfection. It's about His commission and your obedience. Before you go, ask: Am I going in His name or my own ambition? Am I standing on His word or my assumptions? True kingdom movement happens when we surrender our plans to His purposes. You don't need everything figured out, but you do need to know whose you are and who

has sent you. That certainty changes everything about how you move.

Day 5: Childlike Faith and Fearless Obedience

Reading: Matthew 18:1-5; Mark 10:13-16

Devotional: Jesus said we must become like children to enter the kingdom. Children don't calculate risk—they trust and respond immediately. They don't question their worth—they simply receive love. This year, will you trade skepticism for childlike trust? Will you silence the voices of doubt and hear your Father's voice clearly? God is calling you to move with urgency, not recklessness—to act with faith, not presumption. The world needs witnesses who aren't paralyzed by fear of imperfection. As you go into this week, this season, this year, remember: your faith has made you whole. Not your preparation, not your reputation, not others' opinions—your faith in Him. Step forward. The miracle happens as you go.
