



## 5-Day Devotional: Go Light

### Day 1: Let Your Will Be Done

**Reading:** Matthew 6:9-13

**Devotional:** Surrendering to God's will is the foundation of walking in light. When we pray "let your will be done," we're releasing our grip on control and trusting that God's plans surpass our own understanding. This isn't passive resignation—it's active faith. Today, examine the areas where you're holding tightly to your own agenda. Are you willing to align your heart with God's heart? True freedom comes when we stop wrestling with God and start resting in His perfect will. His plans are always for our good, even when the path seems unclear. Declare today: "Lord, let your will be done in my life."

### Day 2: Pack Light

**Reading:** Mark 6:7-13

**Devotional:** Jesus sent His disciples with minimal provisions, teaching them radical dependence on God. What are you carrying that God never asked you to bear? Offense, unforgiveness, worry, and material attachments can weigh us down spiritually. When we pack light, we make room for God's power to work through us. The disciples went out with nothing but returned with testimonies of healing and deliverance. God wants to strip away everything that hinders your spiritual progress. Today, identify one burden you're carrying and intentionally lay it at Jesus' feet. Trust that His strength is sufficient and His provision is guaranteed.

### **Day 3: Carry Light**

**Reading:** John 8:12; Ephesians 5:8-14

**Devotional:** Jesus declared, "I am the light of the world," and then commissioned us to carry that same light. Light exposes darkness, brings clarity, and reveals truth. When we carry Christ, we become agents of transformation wherever we go. The woman caught in adultery encountered light that didn't condemn but redeemed her. This is the light we carry—one that exposes sin while offering grace. Discipleship isn't about impressing others with our holiness or condemning them with judgment. It's about introducing them to Jesus. Today, ask yourself: Am I carrying light or adding to someone's darkness? Let Christ's light shine through your words and actions.

### **Day 4: Be Light**

**Reading:** Matthew 5:14-16

**Devotional:** "You are the light of the world," Jesus declared—not just to the twelve, but to all who believe. This identity isn't earned; it's received through faith in Christ. When you believe Him, you become light. A city on a hill cannot be hidden, and neither should your testimony. Being light means your life reflects Christ in both words and deeds. It means walking in goodness, righteousness, and truth even when surrounded by darkness. Don't hide your light under fear, insecurity, or compromise. Let it shine boldly. Today, consider where God is calling you to shine. Who needs to see the light of Christ through your life?

### **Day 5: Rest in His Yoke**

**Reading:** Matthew 11:28-30

**Devotional:** Jesus invites the weary and heavy-laden to find rest in Him. His yoke is easy and His burden is light—not because following Christ eliminates all difficulty, but because His strength makes our burdens bearable. Being yoked to Christ means His power sustains us through every trial. You don't have to carry emotional weight, offense, or the burdens others place on you. Shake them off and keep moving. Today, practice self-denial by releasing what you've been clinging to and taking up what Christ offers: rest, peace, and supernatural strength. Go light this year by staying yoked to Jesus, trusting His will, and following His lead.
