Luke 15:11-19 New Living Translation Parable of the Lost Son 11 To illustrate the point further, Jesus told them this story: "A man had two sons. 12 The younger son told his father, 'I want my share of your estate now before you die.' So his father agreed to divide his wealth between his sons.

13 "A few days later this younger son packed all his belongings and moved to a distant land, and there he wasted all his money in wild living. 14 About the time his money ran out, a great famine swept over the land, and he began to starve. 15 He persuaded a local farmer to hire him, and the man sent him into his fields to feed the pigs. 16 The young man became so hungry that even the pods he was feeding the pigs looked good to him. But no one gave him anything.

## The Wandering Heart of a King

2 Samuel 12:1-10 New Living Translation Nathan Rebukes David

12 So the Lord sent Nathan the prophet to tell David this story: "There were two men in a certain town. One was rich, and one was poor. 2 The rich man owned a great many sheep and cattle. 3 The poor man owned nothing but one little lamb he had bought. He raised that little lamb, and it grew up with his children. It ate from the man's own plate and drank from his cup. He cuddled it in his arms like a baby daughter. 4 One day a guest arrived at the home of the rich man. But instead of killing an animal from his own flock or herd, he took the poor man's lamb and killed it and prepared it for his guest."

5 David was furious. "As surely as the Lord lives," he vowed, "any man who would do such a thing deserves to die! 6 He must repay four lambs to the poor man for the one he stole and for having no pity."

7 Then Nathan said to David, "You are that man! The Lord, the God of Israel, says: I anointed you king of Israel and saved you from the power of Saul. 8 I gave you your master's house and his wives and the kingdoms of Israel and Judah. And if that had not been enough, I would have given you much, much more. 9 Why, then, have you despised the word of the Lord and done this horrible deed? For you have murdered Uriah the Hittite with the sword of the Ammonites and stolen his wife. 10 From this time on, your family will live by the sword because you have despised me by taking Uriah's wife to be your own.

- Had her brought to him and she became pregnant.
- Brought her husband Uriah home for war to deceive him into thinking the baby was his.
- Had Uriah killed in battle when his plan didn't work.
- Took Bathsheba as his own wife.

# How was the king's LIFE affected?

Failed to love God and others. Lost his sense of identity as a king. Lust and fear caused him to operate outside of faith. Out of position from God's purpose

# The Wandering Heart of a Priest

# 1 Samuel 2:12-36

• The sons of the priest Eli were wicked men who had no respect for the Lord or their priestly duties.

- They would steal the best meat brought for sacrifices to eat for themselves.
- They seduced and had relations with women who worked at the entrance of the Tabernacle.
- Eli knew what was happening and did nothing.

## 1 Samuel 2:27-31

New Living Translation

## A Warning for Eli's Family

27 One day a man of God came to Eli and gave him this message from the Lord: "I revealed myself[a] to your ancestors when they were Pharaoh's slaves in Egypt. 28 I chose your ancestor Aaron[b] from among all the tribes of Israel to be my priest, to offer sacrifices on my altar, to burn incense, and to wear the priestly vest[c] as he served me. And I assigned the sacrificial offerings to you priests. 29 So why do you scorn my sacrifices and offerings? Why do you give your sons more honor than you give me—for you and they have become fat from the best offerings of my people Israel!

30 "Therefore, the Lord, the God of Israel, says: I promised that your branch of the tribe of Levi[d] would always be my priests. But I will honor those who honor me, and I will despise those who think lightly of me. 31 The time is coming when I will put an end to your family, so it will no longer serve as my priests. All the members of your family will die before their time. None will reach old age.

## How was the priest's LIFE affected?

Failed to love God and others. Lost his sense of identity as a priest. Lust and pride caused them to lose their fear of God. Disgraced their priestly purpose.

# **Crossing Over**

Joshua 3:3-5 New Living Translation

3 giving these instructions to the people: "When you see the Levitical priests carrying the Ark of the Covenant of the Lord your God, move out from your positions and follow them. 4 Since you have never traveled this way before, they

will guide you. Stay about half a mile[a] behind them, keeping a clear distance between you and the Ark. Make sure you don't come any closer."

5 Then Joshua told the people, "Purify yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do great wonders among you."

Revelation 22:10-15

New Living Translation
