Where do we need perfected

Genesis 3:6-10

New Living Translation

6 The woman was convinced. She saw that the tree was beautiful and its fruit looked delicious, and she wanted the wisdom it would give her. So she took some of the fruit and ate it. Then she gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it, too. 7 At that moment their eyes were opened, and they suddenly felt shame at their nakedness. So they sewed fig leaves together to cover themselves.

8 When the cool evening breezes were blowing, the man[a] and his wife heard the Lord God walking about in the garden. So they hid from the Lord God among the trees. 9 Then the Lord God called to the man, "Where are you?"

- Where fear and shame exists.
- Where we have covered ourselves with our religion.

- Wherever there isn't a superiority over the flesh by your new spirit.
- Wherever there isn't the mind of Christ.
- Wherever there is torment.

Torment definition: 1. Extreme pain; anguish; the utmost degree of misery, either of body or mind.

What happens when you don't cast your cares on him? Torments

1 John 4:18

Amplified Bible

18 There is no fear in love [dread does not exist]. But perfect (complete, full-grown) love drives out fear, because fear involves [the expectation of divine] punishment, so the one who is afraid [of God's judgment] is not perfected in love [has not grown into a sufficient understanding of God's love].

- Fear to be loved by God because He sees and knows all.
- Fear to love God like He asks because we might lose our desires.
- Fear to love our spiritual lives because we must deny our natural/carnal lives.
- Fear of loving others because of selfishness, rejection, co-dependency, getting what they don't deserve.

Judges 16:4-6
New Living Translation
Samson and Delilah

4 Some time later Samson fell in love with a woman named Delilah, who lived in the valley of Sorek. 5 The rulers of the Philistines went to her and said, "Entice Samson to tell you what makes him so strong and how he can be overpowered and tied up securely. Then each of us will give you 1,100 pieces[a] of silver."

6 So Delilah said to Samson, "Please tell me what makes you so strong and what it would take to tie you up securely."

Judges 16:15-22

New Living Translation

15 Then Delilah pouted, "How can you tell me, 'I love you,' when you don't share your secrets with me? You've made fun of me three times now, and you still haven't told me what makes you so strong!" 16 She tormented him with her nagging day after day until he was sick to death of it.

When he woke up, he thought, "I will do as before and shake myself free." But he didn't realize the Lord had left him.

21 So the Philistines captured him and gouged out his eyes. They took him to Gaza, where he was bound with bronze chains and forced to grind grain in the prison.

- The enemy took his vision, freedom, and purpose.
- What is the objective of the tormentor? To steal our love from God to give it to another, so He can steal our vision, freedom and purpose.
- If Adam and Eve would have had perfect love there would've been no fear
 of God having held back anything, they wouldn't have taken their eyes off
 him, and their hearts off of what He said.
- The enemy goes after your eyes/lust, flesh/ awakens carnal desires, heart/pride of life.

22 But before long, his hair began to grow back.

• But his hair began to grow back and in his final act He devoted his heart to God by sacrificing himself and destroying God's enemies.
