

## LIVING FOR HIS GLORY

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### Scripture

“He has rescued us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son.”

— **Colossians 1:13 (NASB)**

“Whether, then, you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.”

— **1 Corinthians 10:31 (NASB)**

“I glorified You on the earth, having accomplished the work which You have given Me to do.”

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### **1** You Have Been Transferred

Salvation is not an upgrade—it is a relocation.

You were rescued from darkness and transferred into the Kingdom of God’s beloved Son. This wasn’t accidental. It wasn’t random. It was intentional.

Your life is no longer governed by confusion or chance. It is governed by divine design.

As a child of the King, you don’t live randomly—you live representatively.

Every decision, every word, every opportunity carries eternal weight.

You cannot have God and chance at the same time.

If God is sovereign, then your life has purpose.

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### **2** Identity Shapes Destiny

If you don’t know who you are, you won’t know where you’re going.

Identity determines direction.

When you search for meaning outside of Christ, you wander.

But when you embrace who you are in Him—redeemed, loved, empowered—you begin to function according to design.

Misdefined identity leads to misdirected purpose.  
Right identity unlocks divine destiny.

You don't discover purpose first.  
You discover identity—and purpose flows from it.

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### **3 What Are Good Works?**

Good works are not self-made achievements.  
They are Spirit-led assignments.

Biblically, good works:

- Benefit others in time and eternity
- Point people back to God
- Reflect the heart of the Father

When you walk in the works God prepared for you (Ephesians 2:10), you become evidence that His Kingdom is alive and active.

You were not saved to spectate.  
You were saved to participate.

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### **4 Glory Comes Through Finished Assignment**

Jesus glorified the Father by completing His assignment.

Not by popularity.  
Not by applause.  
But by obedience.

You glorify God the same way:

- When you know who you are
- When you live intentionally
- When you walk in obedience
- When you finish what He entrusted to you

You were not created to coast.  
You were created to contribute.

Living for His glory means finishing your work well.

### Reflection

- Are you living by chance or by calling?
- Are you pursuing the works God prepared for you?
- Do you know who you are in Christ?

Ask the Lord to clarify your identity and align your steps with His purpose.

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### Prayer

Father, thank You for rescuing me from darkness and transferring me into the Kingdom of Your Son. Help me to live intentionally and not randomly. Remind me daily of who I am in Christ. Lead me into the good works You have prepared for me. May my life bring You glory as I walk in obedience and purpose. In Jesus' name, Amen.
