

$\hfill\Box$ Freedom from the Voice of Accusation

Scripture:

"For the accuser of our brothers and sisters, who accuses them before our God day and night, has been hurled down." — Revelation 12:10 (NIV)

Main Idea:

The enemy's accusations are constant, but Christ's finished work silences every charge against you.

Head Change (What you think):

Recognize that Satan's voice of accusation is rooted in lies, while God's voice declares you righteous through Jesus.

Heart Change (What you feel):

Rest in the assurance that you are no longer condemned, but covered by the righteousness of Christ.

Life Change (What you do):

When accusation comes, silence it by pointing to the cross and walking boldly in God's grace.

Teaching Points:

1. The Source of Accusation

- o Satan is the father of lies (John 8:44).
- His accusations try to convince you that you're too far gone.
- o Truth: Jesus already dealt with your guilt.

2. Jesus, Your Advocate

- o Zechariah 3 shows God rebuking Satan and clothing Joshua in righteousness.
- o In Christ:
 - Jesus is your defense attorney (1 John 2:1).
 - God has already declared you righteous (2 Cor. 5:21).
 - You wear garments of grace, not guilt.

3. Conviction vs. Condemnation

o Conviction = from the Spirit → leads to repentance and life (2 Cor. 7:10).



- o Condemnation = from Satan → leads to shame and despair.
- o Test the voice: does it lead you back to God or push you away?

4. No Condemnation in Christ

- o Romans 8:1 "No condemnation" belongs to those in Christ.
- Every time Satan points to your past, point to the cross.

Reflection Questions:

- · Am I carrying shame that God has already forgiven?
- Do I listen more to the accuser or my Advocate?
- How would my life change if I lived fully clothed in righteousness?

Prayer:

Father, thank You that I am no longer under condemnation. When the enemy accuses, remind me of the finished work of the cross. Help me silence every lie with Your truth. Thank You for clothing me in righteousness through Jesus. I choose to walk in freedom, grace, and boldness. In Jesus' name, Amen.
