

KINGDOM-MINDED LEADERSHIP

Scripture

“The kingdom of God is not coming with signs to be observed... for behold, the kingdom of God is in your midst.” — Luke 17:20–21 (ESV)

“To them God has chosen to make known... the glorious riches of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.” — Colossians 1:27 (NIV)

Overview

The Kingdom of God is not merely a future destination—it is a present reality. It is the rule and reign of Jesus Christ in and through His people. Wherever the King is honored and obeyed, His Kingdom is revealed.

Kingdom-minded leadership begins with surrender. Before you lead others, you must first live under the rule of the King. The Kingdom is not built through charisma, control, or personal ambition—it advances through obedience, transformation, and Christ-centered living.

Leadership in the Kingdom is not about building your platform. It is about building His Church.

1. The Kingdom Is Within and Among Us

Jesus declared that the Kingdom is not something we simply observe externally—it is an internal reign. When Christ dwells in us, the King takes His throne in our hearts.

But the Kingdom is not private. It becomes visible when the Church lives under His authority.

Individual transformation leads to corporate expression. The Kingdom flows from the heart into the community.

The question is: *Is Christ reigning here?*

4. The Character of a Kingdom-Minded Leader

To be Kingdom-minded is to be Christ-like. This is cultivated through obedience.

- Obey the words of Jesus — His teaching shapes your mindset and conduct.
- Do the works of Jesus — He is building His Church.

We are living stones being built together. Leadership means helping gather, shape, and disciple others into maturity.

This requires:

- **Blueprints** — Build according to God’s Word, not cultural trends.
- **Quality Control** — Don’t just gather people; disciple them deeply.

Kingdom leaders build with eternity in mind.

5. The Mission Is Still the Great Commission

“Go and make disciples of all nations...”

The mission has not changed.

God’s desire is to dwell among His people. His Kingdom advances when we preach the gospel, raise disciples, and build faithfully with excellence.

A Kingdom-minded leader carries the heart of the King—focused on souls, discipleship, and generational impact.
