History: 18th Dynasty of Egypt

Thutmose I - Father unknown, though possibly <u>Amenhotep I</u>. His mother is known to be <u>Senseneb</u>. <u>Thutmose I</u> established family control over the Egyptian throne for the next 175 years.[130]Thutmose I defeated the <u>Kingdom of Kush</u> and destroyed Kerma in <u>Nubia</u>, he campaigned in Syria as far as the <u>Euphrates River.[130]</u> He is also the father of <u>Thutmose II</u> and <u>Hatshepsut.[130]</u>. Moses is born during this reign and adopted by his daughter, most probably the princess who later became Queen Hatshepsut.
