1Corinthians 7

1. Intimacy

- 1. Before you're married intimacy needs to be Guarded
- 2. After you're married intimacy is something to be Invested in
 - 1. Render due affection Appropriate affection
 - 1. Men and women receive and express affection differently.
 - 2. Looking for ways to show and give the affection that the other half likes and enjoys
 - 2. Don't deprive each other except for a time
 - 1. Intimacy Should be regular
 - 2. Intimacy Should not be used to manipulate

2. Permanence

- 1. Before we are married, we should invest in <u>getting to know each other as well as we can</u>. Hit the pause button and slow down. Because we are entering into a <u>permanent</u> relationship, it is a good idea to make sure we're making the best decision.
- 2. Realize that there will be Seasons of difficulty.
 - 1. In a long term, permanent relationship there are going to be seasons of ups and downs. It is important to prepare for, and successfully navigate these seasons. (Pressures at work, change, children, moves).
 - 2. Just knowing that everything will not be a dream come true helps us.
- 3. Some tools to maintain a permanent relationship
 - 1. OK to separate (not divorce or move out, but give each other a little space) and let our emotions cool down so we can address the issue.
 - 2. Talk through issues (we need to value what they're thinking and why they're thinking it)
 - 3. Enlist the help of others
 - 1. In crisis times



2. But also proactively in the good times

3. Lifestyle

- 1. Use your marriage to serve the Lord together.
 - 1. As you serve the Lord together you will find fulfillment outside of yourselves
 - 2. And you will build relationships that will be a great help in your own walk with God.
- 2. Use your marriage to serve one another.
 - 1. A defining characteristic of Christian love is to be focused on loving others as you love yourself.
 - 2. This should mean taking a genuine interest in everything about the other person.
