The Bible will tell us when "God" moves on someone's heart or spirit.

In the first year of King Cyrus of Persia, to fulfill the word of the Lord from the mouth of Jeremiah, <u>the Lord</u> <u>stirred up the spirit of King Cyrus</u> of Persia so that he made a proclamation throughout all his kingdom and also in writing, saying:

We have clear evidence that the Bible will tell us when God stirs up or moves on the heart of man to incite or impel them to do something. We cannot add to the Bible by saying God controls all the hearts of men when there is not one scripture that states that.

The Men of Ninevah <u>Believed & Repented</u> without the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit Came Upon Believers in New **Covenant**.

2 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. 2 And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. 3 Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. The Holy Spirit was given to a <u>few people</u> in the Old Testament. We Acts 2:2-4 NRSV never see where the Holy Spirit was given to make someone believe in God. We see people in the Gospels believing in Jesus without the Holy Spirit. Once people repented, believed then the Holy Spirit came upon

them.

God uses strategy to steer the freewill of man.

17 When Pharaoh let the people go, God did not lead them by way of the land of the Philistines, although that was nearer, for <u>God thought</u>, "If the people face war, <u>they may change</u> <u>their minds</u> and return to Egypt."

God knows that His creation has the power to choose as they will, so God does not lead them by the land of the Philistines to avoid war so His people would not change their minds and try to return back to Egypt.
