Outline of Biblical Usage [?]

- I. in a broad sense: state of him who is as he ought to be, righteousness, the condition acceptable to God 
 - 1. the doctrine concerning the way in which man may attain a state approved of God
 - 2. integrity, virtue, purity of life, rightness, correctness of thinking feeling, and acting
- II. in a narrower sense, justice or the virtue which gives each his due

Outline of Biblical Usage [?]

- I. deliverance, preservation, safety, salvation
 - 1. deliverance from the molestation of enemies
 - 2. in an ethical sense, that which concludes to the soul's safety or salvation
 - 1. of Messianic salvation
- II. salvation as the present possession of all true Christians
- III. future salvation, the sum of benefits and blessings which the Christians, redeemed from all earthly ills, will enjoy after the visible return of Christ from heaven in the consummated and eternal kingdom of God.

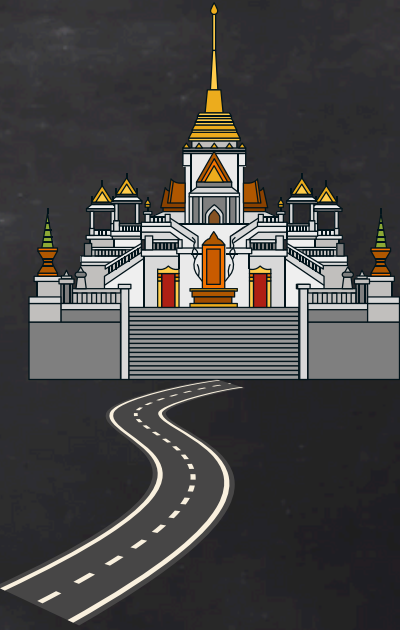
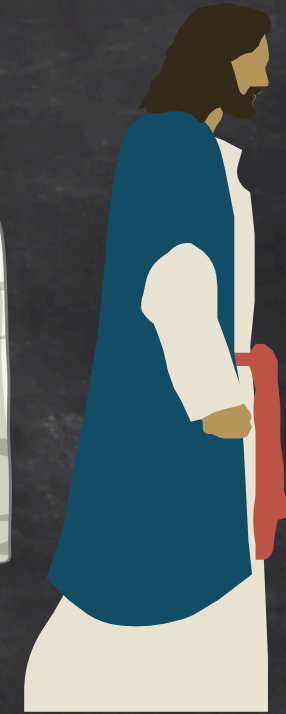
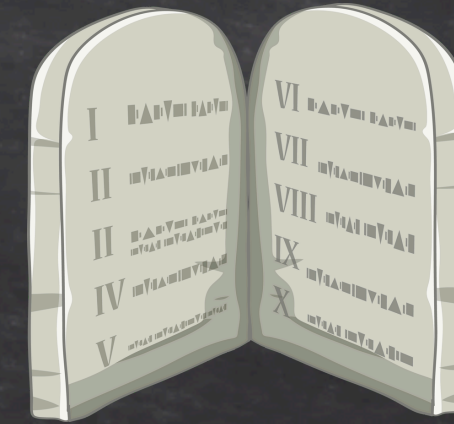
Faith Alone

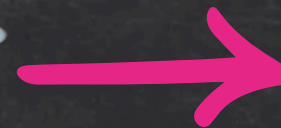

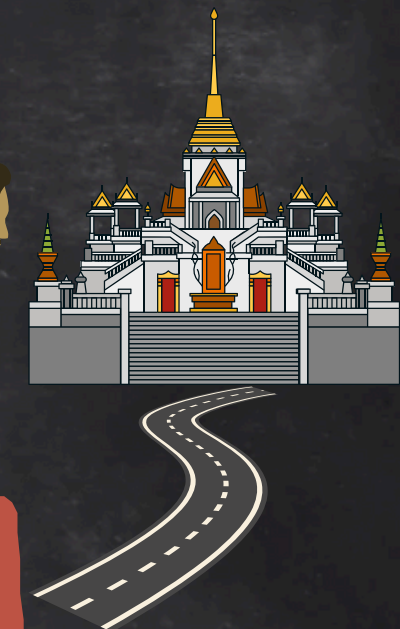

What is required to **Be in Covenant and dwell** with Jesus in His Kingdom forever?

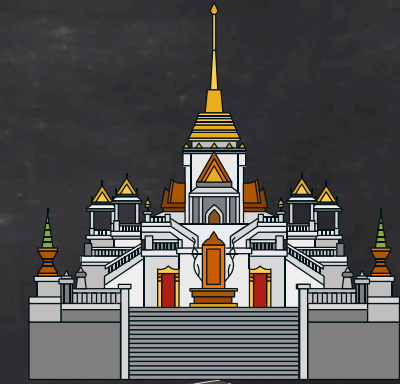
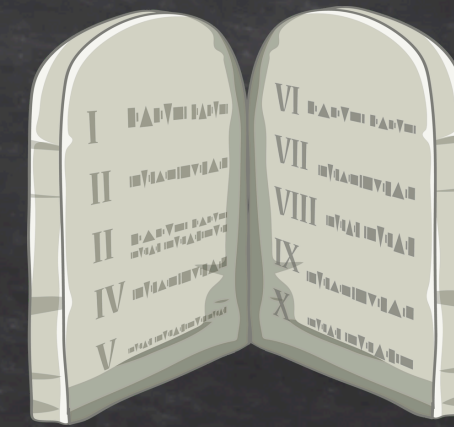
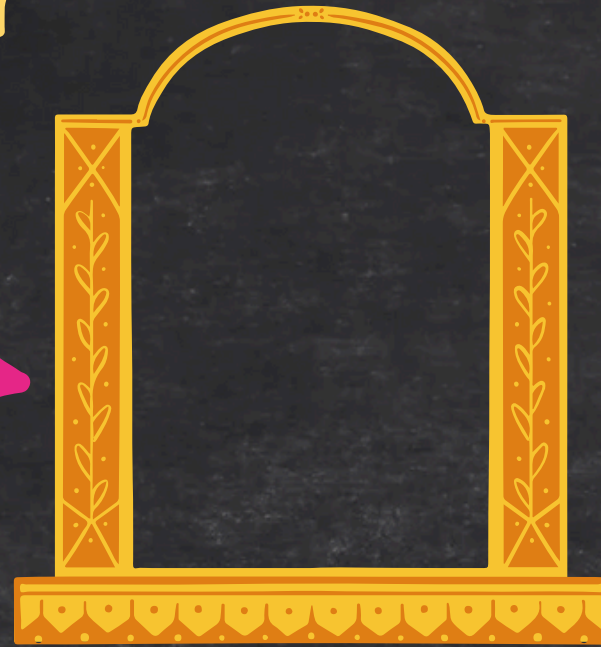
Belief To Enter

Believing in Jesus Christ the Son of God as the atonement for our sins justifies or qualifies us to enter into Covenant with Him.

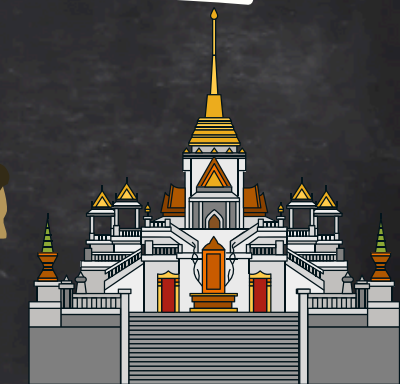
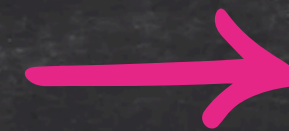
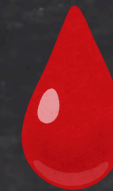
Repentance, Confession, Baptism to Be In Covenant

Outline of Biblical Usage [?]

- I. trusty, faithful
 1. of persons who show themselves faithful in the transaction of business, the execution of commands, or the discharge of official duties
 2. one who kept his plighted faith, worthy of trust
 3. that can be relied on

πιστός, **πιστή**, πιστόν (**πείθω** (which see)) (from Homer down), the Sept. mostly for **יָמֵן**;

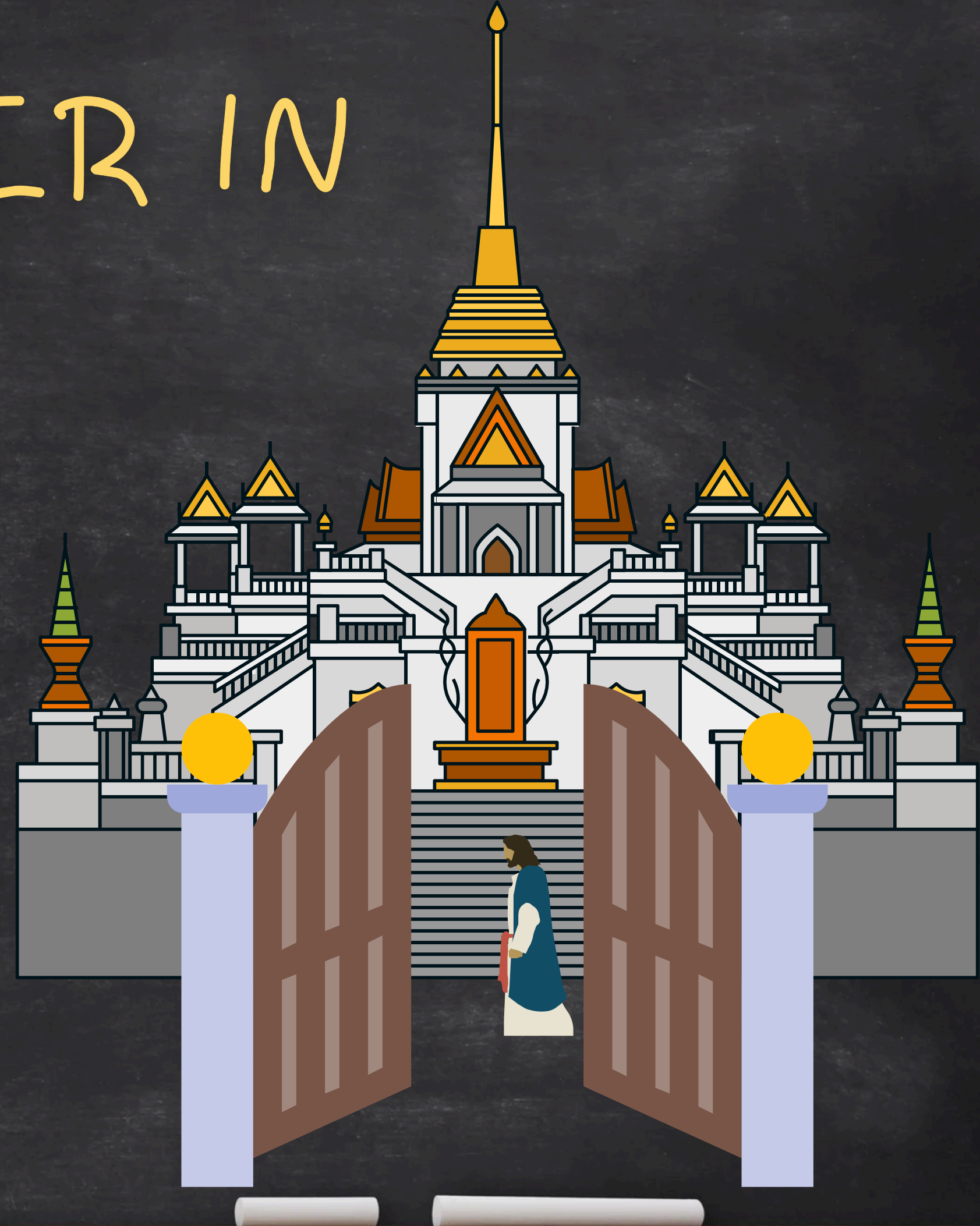
1. **trusty, faithful**; of persons who show themselves faithful in the transaction of business, the execution of commands, or the discharge of official duties: **δοῦλος**, Matthew 24:45; Matthew 25:21, 23; **οἰκονόμος**, Luke 12:42; 1 Corinthians 4:2; **διάκονος**, Ephesians 6:21; Colossians 1:7; Colossians 4:7; **ἀρχιερεύς**,

FAITHFUL ENTER IN
