Confess Jesus

32 Whosoever therefore shall <u>confess</u> <u>me before men</u>, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven. 33 But whosoever shall deny me before men, him will I also deny before my Father which is in heaven. Matthew 10:32-33 KJV

Faith without works is dead

17 Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone.
24 Ye see then how that by works a man is justified, and not by faith only.
James 2:17,24 KJV

Bible Example of faith without works

42 Nevertheless among the chief rulers also <u>many</u> <u>believed on him</u>; but because of the Pharisees <u>they</u> <u>did not confess him</u>, lest they should be put out of the synagogue: 43 For they loved the praise of men more than the



43 For they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God.

John 12:42-43 KJV

These chief rulers <u>BELIEVED</u> in Jesus but <u>DID NOT CONFESS</u> Him because of fear of the Pharisees.

The Greek word **pisteuo** is the same greek word used in Romans 10:9-10 by the Apostle Paul.

These chief rulers had FAITH ALONE but they could NOT BE SAVED because they DID NOT confess (obey) which is a WORK!

<u>Pharisees did not want people to</u> <u>confess Jesus</u>

22 These words spake his parents, because they feared the Jews: for the Jews had agreed already, that <u>if any man did confess that he was Christ</u>, he should be put out of the synagogue. John 9:22 KJV

23 And he said to them all, If any man will come after me, <u>let him deny himself</u>, and take up his cross daily, and follow me.

<u>Chief Rulers DID NOT forsake ALL!</u>

POSSIBLE REFUTE TO JOHN 12:42?

Using John 5:44

44 How can ye believe, <u>which receive honour one</u> of another, and <u>seek not the honour that cometh</u> from God only? John 5:44 KJV

This Scripture may be used by some to refute that the Chief Rulers <u>did not really believe</u> because they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God. This is an <u>assumption</u> as Jesus NEVER says that it is impossible or they couldn't believe because they seek the honor of men.

*Most people teach that TRUE FAITH will AUTOMATICALLY produce works. Is this statement Biblical?

<u>Exegesis</u>

Jesus is asking this group of people a question saying, "how can you believe when you are receiving honor from man instead of <u>SEEKING</u> glory from God?" Jesus' question is addressing their <u>FOCUS</u>. They are <u>seeking glory</u> from man instead from God. This <u>does NOT</u> imply that they could not believe or have faith. The chief rulers believed later on but because of FEAR they did not confess Jesus. They loved the praise of men more than loving God (dead faith James 2:17). Jesus tells the group in John 5 what they DO NOT HAVE in John 5:42.

RESPONDING TO THE REFUTE OF JOHN 12:42

John 5:42

42 But I know you, that ye <u>have not the love of God in you</u>.

John 5:42 KJV

Is it possible to have faith but NOT have the love of God? YES! 1 John 4:8

Is it possible to have faith in Jesus but be in fear? YES!

Do we have Biblical Evidence of people having FAITH but no WORKS because of FEAR and loving the praise of men? YES!

Does Faith "automatically" produce works? NO! (it doesn't automatically, meaning always, but it can produce works)

What else produces works of obedience?

Jesus said, If you <u>LOVE</u> Me <u>you will obey</u> my commandments. (John 14:15, John 14:21, John 14:23-24.)

Paul says our faith must be activated by <u>LOVE.</u> (Galatians 5:6)

John says, perfect LOVE casts out fear. (1 John 4:18)

1st & Greatest commandment is to <u>LOVE</u> GOD with <u>ALL</u> your heart, soul, mind, and strength. Many have faith but lack the love of God.

WE DON'T HAVE TO LOVE GOD?

Teaching Faith without Loving God?

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13 And so faith, hope, love abide [faith—conviction and belief respecting man's relation to God and divine things; hope joyful and confident expectation of eternal salvation; love true affection for God and man, growing out of God's love for and in us], these three; but the greatest of these is love. 1 Corinthians 13:13 AMPC



Teaching we are saved without obedience is teaching we DO

NOT have to love God.
