#### JESUS PREACHED REPENT

### MATTHEW 4:17

17 From that time Jesus began to proclaim, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."

### LUKE 13

3 No, I tell you, but unless you repent you will all perish as they did

#### 8. Revelation 2–3 (spoken by Jesus after resurrection)

Jesus continues to command repentance to the churches:

- Revelation 2:5 "Repent and do the works you did at first."
- Revelation 2:16 "Repent, or I will come to you quickly."
- Revelation 3:3 "Remember... repent."
- Revelation 3:19 "As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten; therefore be zealous and repent."

These are **Jesus speaking directly** to the churches.

#### Outline of Biblical Usage [?]

- L to change one's mind, i.e. to repent
- Ito change one's mind for better, heartily to amend with abhorrence of one's past sins

Additional information from the Outline of Biblical Usage: "Repentance (*metanoia*, 'change of mind') involves a turning with contrition from sin to God; the repentant sinner is in the proper condition to accept the divine forgiveness." (F. F. Bruce. *The Acts of the Apostles* [Greek Text Commentary], London: Tyndale, 1952, p. 97.)

## Apostles Preach Repent

#### **PETER**

"Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

**Acts 2:38** 

#### **PAUL**

20 but declared first to those in Damascus, then in Jerusalem and throughout the countryside of Judea, and also to the gentiles, that they should repent and turn to God and do deeds consistent with repentance. Acts 26:20

#### **PAUL**

overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent,

Acts 17:30

### JOHN THE BAPTIST

8 Bear fruits that are deserving and consistent with [your] repentance [that is, conduct worthy of a heart changed, a heart abhorring sin]. And do not begin to say to yourselves, We have Abraham as our father; for I tell

you that God is able from these stones to raise up descendants for Abraham.

9 Even now the ax is laid to the root of the trees, so that every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and cast into the fire.

10 And the multitudes asked him, **Then what shall we do?** 

11 And he replied to them, He who has two tunics (undergarments), let him share with him who has none; and he who has food, let him do it the same way.

12 Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they said to him, Teacher, what shall we do?

13 And he said to them, Exact and collect no more than the fixed amount appointed you.

14 Those serving as soldiers also asked him, **And we, what shall we do?** And he replied to them, Never demand or enforce by terrifying people or by accusing wrongfully, and always be satisfied with your rations (supplies) and with your allowance (wages).



# Did Not Confess

### Pharisees Cast Out Anyone Who confess Jesus

22 His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jews, for the Jews had already agreed that anyone who confessed Jesus to be the Messiah would be put out of the synagogue.

#### John 9:22 NRSV

### **Chief Authorities Believe but No Confession**

42 Nevertheless many, even of the authorities, <u>believed in him</u>. But because of the Pharisees <u>they did not confess it</u>, <u>for fear</u> that they would be put out of the synagogue, 43 for *they loved human glory* more than the glory that comes from God.

John 12:42-43 NRSV

### Born of Water & Spirit



3 Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be **born again**, he cannot see the kingdom of God.

5 Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.

John 3:3,5 KJV

When Jesus was baptized in **WATER**, the **HOLY SPIRIT** came down upon Him.







After Jesus tells Nicodemus about being born of water and Spirit to enter the Kingdom of God we see some verses down that Jesus and His disciples were baptizing people. Many of the Pharisees rejected John's Baptism. **Luke 7:29-30** 

### Water & Spirit for Salvation



### Definition of Faithful

- trusty, faithful
  - of persons who show themselves faithful in the transaction of business, the execution of commands, or the discharge of official duties
  - 2. one who kept his plighted faith, worthy of trust
  - 3. that can be relied on

πιστός, πιστή, πιστόν (πείθω (which see)) (from Homer down), the Sept. mostly for גְאֵבֶן;
