COMES & BELIEVES THE WORD COMES IS A SYLLEPSIS

<u>Definition</u>: a figure of speech in which a word is applied to two others in different <u>senses</u>. The word is used <u>literally</u> and <u>figuratively</u> at the <u>same time</u>.

FOR EXAMPLE: In 'opening the door and heart to the homeless boy,' for instance, opening the heart opens the door, for it is the heart that opens or closes the door; to 'open' yokes the 'heart' inside with the 'door' outside.

ηκω hḗkō, hay'-ko; a primary verb; to arrive, i.e. be present (literally or figuratively):
—come.

HOW IS COMING LITERAL? VERSE 36 & 37 BRING CONTEXT

36 But I said to you that you have seen me and yet do not believe.

John 6:36 NRSV

Anyone who **came** to Jesus and followed Him as a disciple, He will never drive them away or cast them away from His physical presence or fellowship. The audience understood this because the Pharisees would cast people out of the synagogue. "Jesus didn't say anyone who *believed in Me*, He would never drive away." He said "comes to me," as in fellowship and being a literal follower while on earth.

IS JOHN 6 ABOUT US?



37 Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and anyone who comes to me I will never drive away,

John 6:37 NRSV

Jesus makes this very clear that He is speaking about those who the Father has given Him.

None of us were born when Jesus said this.

6 "I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. 7 Now they know that everything you have given me is from you, 8 for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you, and they have believed that you sent me.

John 17:6-8 NRSV

JOHN 6 IS NOT ABOUT US

Jesus is speaking in past tense about those whom the Father has given Him.

6 "I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. 7 Now they know that everything you have given me is from you, 8 for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you, and they have believed that you sent me. **John 17:6-8 NRSV**

John 6 is talking about the disciples who physically followed Jesus during that time.

37 Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and anyone who comes to me I will never drive away,

John 6:37 NRSV

64 But among you there are some who do not believe." For **Jesus knew from the beginning who were the ones** who <u>did not believe</u> and who was the one who

would betray him. 65 And he said, "For this reason I have told you that **no one can**<u>come to me</u> unless it is granted by the Father."

66 Because of this many of <u>his disciples turned</u> back and no longer went about with him.

John 6:64-66 NRSV

Jesus didn't drive or cast those disciples away they left on their own. His 12 disciples stayed.

TWO DIFFERENT GROUPS

THE DISCIPLES

39 And this is the <u>will of him</u> who sent me, that I <u>should lose nothing</u> of all that he has given me but raise it up on the last day.

John 6:39 NRSV

EVERYONE ELSE WHO SAW JESUS & BELIEVED

40 This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day."

John 6:40 NRSV

VERSE 39

39 And this is the <u>will of him</u> who sent me, that I <u>should lose nothing</u> of all that he has given me but raise it up on the last day.

John 6:39 NRSV

THE ANSWERTO VERSE 39

12 While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled.

John 17:12 NRSV

VERSE 40

40 This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day."

Thayer's Greek Lexicon

1. **to he a spectator, look at, behold,** German *schauen* (the $\theta \epsilon \omega \rho o \iota$ were men who attended the games or the sacrifices as public deputies; cf. Grimm on 2 Macc. 4:19); absolutely: Matthew 27:55; Mark 15:40; Luke 23:35; followed by indirect discourse, Mark 12:41; Mark 15:47; used especially of persons and things looked upon as in some respect noteworthy: $\tau \iota \nu \alpha$, John 6:40; John 16:10, 16ff,19;

Jesus means all who have <u>literally</u> seen Him with their <u>own eyes</u>. John 6:40 is <u>NOT</u> about us who have <u>NOT</u> seen Him.

WE HAVE NOT SEEN THE SON

29 Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

John 20:29 NRSV



8 Although you have not seen him, you love him, and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy,

1 Peter 1:8 NRSV

We have **NOT** seen Jesus but we **BELIEVE**.

JOHN 6 FULFILLED IN JOHN 17

14 I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. 15 I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. 16 They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. 17 Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. 18 As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. 19 And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.

20 "I ask not only on behalf of these <u>but also on behalf of those who believe</u> <u>in me through their word</u>, 21 that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me.

John 17:14-21 NRSV

It is clear that the apostles <u>were given to the Son</u> by the Father. Jesus prays for those given to him and then for us and the rest who will believe through the apostle's preaching.

DISCIPLES & US

The Father gave the Son the Disciples.

32 And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself."

John 12:32 NRSV

The Son draws All people to Himself.

16 I have <u>other sheep</u> that do not belong to this fold. <u>I must bring</u> them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.

John 10:16 NRSV

ALL MAY BE ONE

20 "I ask not only on behalf of these but also on behalf of those who believe in me through their word, 21 that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. John 17:20-21 NRSV

16 I have <u>other sheep</u> that do not belong to this fold. <u>I must bring</u> them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.

John 10:16 NRSV

Jesus prays for the other sheep in John 17 that they all may be one.
