WE SEE THAT THE WORDS I NEVER KNEW YOU WAS A COMMON FORM OF REJECTION USED IN HEBREW CULTURE. A RABBI WOULD SAY THESE WORDS TO A DISOBEDIENT DISCIPLE AND PUT THEM ON A TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT BAN.

Many mainstream Jews felt that most Jews would be saved, but some, like Jesus, warned that most people would be lost (e.g., the later apocalyptic author of 4 Ezra 7:45 – 61; 8:1 – 3). 7:15 sheep's clothing ... wolves. Wolves coming disguised as sheep was a common image (even in one of Aesop's fables), though it is also graphic hyperbole: wolves do not wear clothing, and it was impossible to transform one's skin (Jer 13:23). Wolves were the most obvious and common predators of sheep, killing sheep to feed themselves; their image was often used to represent humans who would harm others. Judeans and Galileans were well aware that some prophets were false; indeed, on multiple occasions, in the decades following Jesus' ministry, alleged prophets led followers to destruction at the hands of Rome's armies. **7:16** See note on Jas 3:12. 7:21 - 22 Although Greek and Jewish accounts sometimes delegated judgment to an exalted human, the ultimate judge in Jewish belief was God. Some Jewish exorcists invoked Solomon's name to try to expel demons (Josephus, Antiquities 8.47), but the sense here may exalt Jesus more: Jewish people more often could speak of acting (e.g., 1Sa 17:45; Ps 118:11 - 12) or prophesying (e.g., Dt 18:22; 1 Esdras 6:1) in the name of God. 7:23 I never knew you. - properly positioned so as to be level, <u>upright</u>, or symmetrical. "he made sure his tie was straight"

3. not evasive; honest.

"a straight answer"

Similar: honest direct frank candid truthful sincere forthright

- simple; straightforward.
   "a straight choice between nuclear power and penury"
- (of a look) bold and steady.
   "he gave her a straight, no-nonsense look"
- (of thinking) clear, logical, and unemotional.

Similar: logical rational clear lucid sound coherent unemotional

- (especially of drama) serious as opposed to comic or musical.
   "a straight play"
- 4. in continuous succession.

"he scored his fourth straight win"

Similar: successive in succession consecutive in a row one after the other

supporting all the principles and candidates of one political party.

"he looked pretty straight in his work clothes"

Similar: respectable upright upstanding honorable honest on the level

not under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

adverb: straight

in a straight line; directly.
 "he was gazing straight at her"

Similar: right directly squarely full plumb smack bang slap bang

with no delay or <u>diversion</u>; directly or immediately.
 "after dinner we went straight back to our hotel"

Similar: directly right by a direct route without deviating in a beeline

   at once; immediately.

  "I'll fetch up the bath to you straight"
- in or into a level, even, or <u>upright</u> position. "he pulled his clothes straight"

3. correctly; clearly.

"I'm so tired I can hardly think straight"

Similar: logically rationally clearly lucidly coherently cogently

honestly and directly; in a straightforward manner.

"I told her straight—the kid's right"

Similar: frankly directly straight out candidly honestly forthrightly

4. without a break; continuously.

"he remembered working sixteen hours straight"


