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4. Why do you think the master in this story seems harsh toward the third servant? What do you think was Jesus' point here?

| 5. Pastor Harry said this parable shows us that "everyone has received something from God." Do people typically live like they believe this is true? Why or why not? |
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| 6. "What we have is less important than what we <i>do</i> with what we have." What did Pastor Harry mean by this statement? |
| Can the poorest person do as much for God with their resources as the richest one? How? |
| 7. What is the one thing we can give back to God that He first didn't already give us? |
| 8. Consider this quote by missionary Jim Elliot: "He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain what he cannot lose." – What was he getting at? What do we get to keep? What cannot be lost? |
