THE DRAMA OF REJECTION AND EMBRACE I Peter 2:4-10 June 2, 2019 Dr. Glen Scorgie

Theme: We continue our "Temporary Residents in a Foreign Land" series on the Epistle of 1 Peter by considering 1 Peter 2:4-10. Here the Epistle gets "geological" as it veers rather unexpectedly into the topic of stones to explore a striking paradox (*living* stones) and a grand reversal. Once again, Christ sets the pattern—discarded by people as worthless, but in the end the very cornerstone of what God is building. Spoiler alert: His followers may have parallel experiences—disdained by their fellow - citizens, but treasured in God's sight.

Takeaway: Social acceptance and approval are seldom reliable indicators of who God values and approves. This text is an encouraging reminder that those the world disdainfully rejects and belittles may actually be the ones God the Father most deeply appreciates, and to whom He is most committed. Whatever happens, God's embrace of us is strong and sure, for He has made us His people.
