Lord of the Sabbath

Mark 2:23-3:6
December 4, 2016

Theme: When the Pharisees accuse Jesus' disciples of picking grain (and so working) on the Sabbath, Jesus points to the example of David to show that the Sabbath was made for people and not vice versa. Another time Jesus openly heals a man on the Sabbath, even though the religious leaders were trying to trap him, demonstrating that the Sabbath is truly fulfilled by doing good rather than by doing evil.

 - Jesus' anger (v. 5a)
 - The healing (v. 5b)
 - e. The plot against Jesus (v. 6)

<u>Takeaway</u>: Jesus' teaching about the Sabbath reminds us that God cares deeply for us and always has our best interest in mind.
