"Dangerous Ambition" Absalom Returns to Jerusalem & Conspires against David

2 Samuel 14:1-15:12 June 24, 2018 Dr. Mark Strauss

Theme: After Absalom murders his brother Amnon, he escapes to his relatives in Geshur. Though David longs to be reconciled to his son, he is unwilling to initiate that reconciliation. His general, Joab, eventually arranges the reconciliation by sending a woman to David with a fictional story of a man's estrangement from his mother and his family. David recognizes himself in the story and allows Joab to bring Absalom back to Jerusalem. Yet Absalom has ambitions to be king and plots to overthrow David.

- 3. Absalom Steals the Hearts of the People of Israel (15:1–12)
 - a. Absalom's PR Campaign, 15:1-6
 - b. The coup begins: Absalom's plans to be declared king, 15:7-12

<u>Takeaway</u>: True reconciliation is more than a cessation of hostility. It occurs when we seek the best for the other person.
