James 1:1-8

Key Truth

God uses trials to reveal our faith, produce endurance, and draw us to seek His wisdom.

I. The Transformation of James

James 1:1

- From unbeliever to servant
- From brother of Jesus to servant of Jesus
- From doubt to devotion

1 Corinthians 15:7

Main Idea:

A genuine encounter with Jesus changes everything.

II. Trials Produce Endurance

James 1:2-4

"Count it all joy..."

Trials:

- Test our faith
- Produce endurance
- Reveal what we truly trust
- Mature us spiritually

Main Idea:

God does not waste our trials.

III. We Need God's Wisdom

James 1:5

"If any of you lacks wisdom..."

Wisdom is:

- Knowing what to do
- Supernatural guidance
- Freely given by God

God Gives:

- Generously
- Without reproach
- To those who ask

Main Idea:

Before running to the world, run to God.

IV. Trust God Without Doubting

James 1:6-8

Doubt Produces:

- Instability
- Confusion
- Double-mindedness

Faith Produces:

- Confidence
- Stability
- Endurance

Main Idea:

Wisdom and faith go together.
