²⁻⁴ Pray diligently. Stay alert, with your eyes wide open in gratitude. Don't forget to pray for us, that God will open doors for telling the mystery of Christ, even while I'm locked up in this jail. Pray that every time I open my mouth I'll be able to make Christ plain as day to them.

⁵⁻⁶ Use your heads as you live and work among outsiders. Don't miss a trick. Make the most of every opportunity. Be gracious in your speech. The goal is to bring out the best in others in a conversation, not put them down, not cut them out.

Main Idea: As believers, we are called to participate in God's redemptive plan through specific prayers for gospel advancement and strategic plans for personal engagement.

DIG DEEPER QUESTIONS:

- 1. In what ways have you been tempted to be a bystander when it comes to engaging the world with the gospel?
- 2. Why is prayer so important to the further spread of the gospel among us?

- 7. Why should we not be argumentative when sharing the gospel?

- 9. What are some ways we might entangle our gospel presentations with things that distract from the gospel?
- 10. How does this passage encourage you to participate in the work of evangelism?
