ICEBREAKER: There are a lot of characters, real and imagined that are a part of our Christmas celebration. With which of the following do you identify most, and why? The Shepherds, The Grinch, The Wise Men, Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer, Mary, Joseph, or Frosty the Snowman?

INTRODUCTION: Heaven responds with praise at the announcement of the birth of Christ to the shepherds. The shepherds then resign from their present occupation with the sheep to locate and worship the new born King. They adopt a new job once they find him, leaving to proclaim the good news of what God has done. Joy and proclamation of promised salvation dominate this account. How might we resign from lesser pursuits in our lives to adopt greater occupations that empower us to fulfill the mandates of God's kingdom? That's the call and that's the challenge.

SCRIPTURE: Read Luke 2:8-18

DISCUSSION:

- 1. What stood out in today's message? What's one thing you learned? What questions came to mind as you listened to the message today?
- 2. What message did the angel deliver to the shepherds? What does it mean that Jesus was announced as "a Savior, who is Christ the Lord?" In what ways is Jesus Savior, Christ, and Lord?
- 3. What sign did the angel give the shepherds to indicate where they would find the Christ child? What appeared before the shepherds while receiving the announcement about Jesus' birth (verses 13-14)? Is it significant that the angels gave praise to God as part of this announcement? Why or why not?
- 4. When you see God moving in your life or the lives of those around you, do you respond with praise to God? How did the shepherds respond to the announcement that the angels made to them about Jesus' birth (verses 15-20)?

5. Is it important that the shepherds went with haste? What does their response say about the value they placed on the announcement of Jesus' birth into the world? What did the shepherds do after they had seen Jesus? Are you excited to share the story of Jesus with those you interact with in your daily life? What things prevent you from telling others about Jesus?

CHALLENGE: As we prepare to celebrate Christmas again this year, use the story of the glory of God coming into the lives of average shepherds at night to remind you that Jesus came to have a relationship with all people and shows up when we least expect it.

SERVE: Commit to telling others about the way God is working in your life and about the praise and glory that you are giving to God as a result.
