JESUS OVER EVERYTHING: A STUDY IN COLOSSIANS

Today's Lesson: The Celebration of the Church

Colossians 1:1-8: New International Version

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother, ² To God's holy people in Colossae, the faithful brothers and sisters in Christ: Grace and peace to you from God our Father.

³We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, ⁴ because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all God's people— ⁵ the faith and love that spring from the hope stored up for you in heaven and about which you have already heard in the true message of the gospel ⁶ that has come to you.

In the same way, the gospel is bearing fruit and growing throughout the whole world—just as it has been doing among you since the day you heard it and truly understood God's grace. ⁷You learned it from Epaphras, our dear fellow servant, who

is a faithful minister of Christ on our behalf,⁸ and who also told us of your love in the Spirit.

Colossians 3:1: Since then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God.

Colossians 2:6: So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live in him.

Acts 19:10 says that during that time "all ... who lived in the province of Asia [which included Colosse] heard the word of the Lord."

Gnosticism: The very word for Gnosticism comes from the Greek word gnosis, which means "to know." The Gnostics, "people in the know," the spiritual elite with all the answers, held as their basic doctrine that matter (anything physical or created) was evil and that only the spirit was good.
