ICEBREAKER: What movies, shows, stories, have shaped your understanding of the story of Exodus in the Old Testament? Share what you remember about Moses and the people of Israel.

INTRODUCTION: The word Exodus comes from a Greek word that literally means "the road out." An exodus is a "going out, a departure." That defines the substance of much of our spiritual journey it's about being moved out from one place and into a new one. All spiritual growth has something to do with leaving something behind. It's about being saved from something, for something. God providentially positions people to aid us along the way. Today, we meet a woman named Jocobeth, a new mother in a situation of crisis. Despite the chaos around her, she saw something special in her new child that moved her out of despair into a perilous posture of hope.

SCRIPTURE: Read Exodus 2 and Hebrews 11:23

DISCUSSION:

- 1. What stood out in today's message? What's one thing you learned? What questions came to mind as you listened to the message today?
- 2. The story of Exodus opens with slavery. What types of slavery are evident in our world today? What are some ways individuals can be held captive? What systems in society support slavery? In what form?
- 3. Moses is saved because his mother saw he was "no ordinary child." What has shaped your understanding of salvation? Has the story for you been individual, collective, or both? How does that perspective shape how your faith is lived out?
- 4. When we honestly consider our history, there are a lot of ways that America looks more like the Egyptians than the Israelites. Consider: up to 20,000 people are trafficked into the US every year. African Americans five times more likely to be incarcerated than anybody else. Income inequality is the highest it's been in the last 50 years. We are both captive and captor. We are both the oppressed and the oppressor. What should be our response?

CHALLENGE: Pray about how you can stand in solidarity with the suffering in our community. Vote. Advocate. Give time and resources to causes that matter to you.

SERVE: Pray over Exodus 2 and Hebrews 11:23 this week. Praise God for the people in your life who encouraged you and invested in you. Pause to consider for a moment young people you know who
