Ephesians 1:18-23

¹⁸ I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people,¹⁹ and his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength ²⁰ he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, ²¹ far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. ²² And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, ²³ which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way.

1. THE _____ OF CHRIST

1) “[P]ower.” is the word we get from and is used over 100 times in the (*Dunamis*) New Testament. It indicates dynamite raw power or strength.

2) “(W)orking.” *Energeia*, from which we derive our word means “inworking” and suggests the inward propulsion of power.

3) energy, “[M]ighty” (*Kratos*) means “ability to conquer,” as when Caesar conquered Cleopatra. Autocrat comes from this word.

4) “[S]trength” (*Ischus*) refers to physical force. These graphic synonyms in the Pauline bouquet depict the awesome extent of God’s power.
