Key Takeaways: One of the problems with going to church for a long time is that we lose the wonder of the Gospel. We start to assume the good life we have in Christ was a result of something we did. We forget our helplessness and begin to lose the wonder of serving. We get selfish.

What are the signs of this selfish shift in your life?

- 1. Your time is more important than others
- 2. Serving becomes less necessary in your mind
- 3. New Christians earn their stripes by serving you
- 4. You're "experienced" and have paid your dues

Who is God looking for? - God wants those willing to humble themselves to the point that no task is too small or too big. Phil 2:5-7 - Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men.

What about Him? There is another "him" warring against God's truth in your life - Satan.

Only Christ and the Gospel are strong enough to defeat his lies. We must come under the Gospel process in order to allow God to deal with the brokenness of our soul.
