#### "GOD WANTS TO GIVE YOUR LIFE A HAPPY ENDING"

#### RECAP OF THE MAJOR LESSONS FROM JOB

Overall theme: Those who fear God will NEVER turn against Him

- Our relationship status with God is NEVER to be measured by our material or earthly blessings, but measured only by our fear of God and desire to obey Him

### Righteousness vs sinlessness

- righteousness is attained by believing in what God has revealed to us Job's righteousness was a result of his fear of God
- sinlessness = complete perfection, holiness (Jesus!)

### 4 categories of suffering:

1) Suffering caused by our own sin

Proper response: Repentance and faith in Jesus for our forgiveness

2) Suffering caused by sins committed against us Proper response: forgive as we have been forgiven

3) Suffering as a result of living in a sinful, fallen, and broken world Proper response: Remember that our hope is in eternal blessings in heaven as our inheritance through Christ

## 4) Suffering as a result of persecution

Proper response: Rejoice! Because persecution for the sake of righteousness is a sign that a Christian is genuinely and properly living out their faith regardless of who is watching. To be persecuted for the sake of Christ is a reassuring sign that the person fears God more than man.

#### JESUS-THE GREATER JOB

Jesus	Job
Satan tempted Him to sin against God (Matthew 4:1-11)	Satan tried to get Job to curse God (Job 1:11-12)

Intercedes between God and man (1 Timothy 2:5)	Interceded for family and friends (Job 1:5, 42:7-9)
Is exalted at the right hand of the Father (Acts 2:33)	Is doubly blessed after his sufferings (Job 42:10-17)
Remained obedient to the point of death (Philippians 2:8)	Remained faithful while believing God was punishing him (Job 13:15)
Suffered the full cup of God's wrath for sinners (Matthew 26:42)	Suffered innocently, thinking it was God's wrath (Job 30:20-23)
Jesus IS righteousness! (1 Corinthians 1:30-31)	Job was more righteous than anyone else (Job 1:8)

#### ENDINGS OF THE BOOK OF THE BIBLE

- 1. Endings of the books of the Bible
  - 1. Genesis: Joseph's family is saved from the famine
  - 2. Exodus: God leads Israel away from Egypt
  - 3. Leviticus/Numbers: God gives Israel commands to live prosperously
  - 4. Deuteronomy: Moses dies, leads Israel up to the edge of the promised land
  - 5. Joshua: Joshua dies, leads Israel INTO the promised land
  - 6. Judges: Israel does what is right in their own eyes
  - 7. Ruth: Davidic line begins
  - 8. 1 Samuel: Saul & sons killed in battle
  - 9. 1 Samuel: David repents and saves Israel from a plague
  - 10.1 Kings: evil kings rule over Israel
  - 11. 2 Kings: Babylon conquers Judah
  - 12.1 Chronicles: Death of David
  - 13. 2 Chronicles: Cyrus permits God's people to return to Jerusalem
  - 14. Ezra/Nehemiah: God's people repent of their sins

- 15. Esther: Jews are saved from genocide
- 16. Jonah: Ninevites are saved from destruction
- 17. Daniel: God encourages Daniel to persevere to the end
- 18. Major/minor prophets: The Messiah, Day of the Lord (day of judgment)
- 19. The Gospels: Jesus is risen!
- 20. Acts of the Apostles: Paul awaiting his death in prison, but still preaching the Gospel
- 21. Revelation: All things are made NEW for all eternity!
