Central Idea: Jesus calls His followers to set side personal rights and to live out a self-sacrificial love for others.

Matthew 5.38-48

Now What?

- Our personal relationships should be marked by a strong love so powerful that we reject any form of retaliation and in its place, selfsacrifice.
- 2. Divine love is indiscriminate love, shown equally to all people, even those who hate us.
- 3. When we live with our inner righteousness on display, the Christian counterculture becomes very visible.

Questions for Personal Reflection or Group Discussion

- 1. What do you find most difficult about Jesus' instruction in this passage?
- 2. What are some ways in which you're tempted to seek your own revenge and stand up for your rights?
- 3. How does Jesus' emphasis on yielding personal rights differ from what the world says?
- 4. Have you ever turned the other cheek, handed over the coat or gone the second mile? What was the result?
- 5. We might struggle to apply Jesus' words about enemies because we don't think we have any. But where do believers often find opposition today? Who are some "enemies" we might face?
- 6. Think of people (or groups) you find easy to love and hard to love. Why do you think you respond to each as you do?
- 7. How does loving and praying for our enemies display our relationship as children of God?
