- 1. Can you think of other times in Jesus' life when His actions seem strange or inappropriate?
- 2. What was your first reaction to the cursing of the fig tree? How does it differ from other miracles Jesus performed?
- 3. What do both the cursing of the fig tree and the cleansing of the temple tell us about Jesus' attitude toward the spiritual condition of the people of Israel?
- 4. These things took place in the court of the Gentiles where Gentiles could come to worship God. Certainly, the buying and selling going on hindered that. What sort of practices in the church today hinder unbelievers from coming to know Christ?
- 5. Both the fig tree and the temple looked beautiful but bore no fruit. Ask God to show you one specific area of your life which may appear spiritually vibrant but lacks maturity.


As they passed by in the morning, they saw the fig tree withered away from the roots


