- 3. Read John 1.43-46 and 7.40-52 and consider how people in Jesus' day thought about Galilee in general and Nazareth in particular. Why do we tend to so easily judge people based on where they are from, how they talk or what they look like?
- 4. Read James 2.1-10 and Phil 2.1-11. What do these passages teach us about how we should view others? What key principles do these passages teach?
- 5. The Christmas story teaches us a lot about humility. What are ways we see this important characteristic throughout the Christmas story and what does that teach us?


