
- 1. Why do you think the OT and NT Scriptures so often warn of false prophets and at the end of His sermon Jesus does the same?
- 2. Think through each of the major areas of doctrine in the Bible and identify/discuss the most prevalent false teaching we should beware of in each of them.



But a prophet who presumes to speak in my name anything I have not commanded, or a prophet who speaks in the name of other gods, is to be put to death."

You may say to yourselves, "How can we know when a message has not been spoken by the LORD?"

If what a prophet proclaims in the name of the LORD does not take place or come true, that is a message the LORD has not spoken. That prophet has spoken presumptuously, so do not be alarmed.

Then the LORD said to me, "The prophets are prophesying lies in my name. I have not sent them or appointed them or spoken to them. They are prophesying to you false visions, divinations, idolatries and the delusions of their own minds.
