- 3. What are your circles of influence your Jerusalem, your Judea and Samaria? How do you share Christ where you are?
- 4. Each of the following verses give us a way to pray as we evangelize. Read each one and identify how to pray. How can we make these a part of your prayer life? (Lk 10.2, Col 4.3, Acts 4.29, 2 Thess 3.1, 2 Thess 3.2, 1 Tim 2.1-4)
