


Obedience (hypakoe) =
Attentive harkening, submission




Suffering (pascho) = To suffer
sadness; be in a bad plight

Obedience does not necessarily equate to a safe, easy life. It might even produce it's own source of suffering.

“My soul is very sorrowful, even to death . . . And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, saying, “My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will.””

Even though Jesus was God's Son, he learned **obedience** from the things he **suffered**. In this way, God qualified him as a **perfect** High Priest,



Jesus did not pass from disobedience to obedience, but learned obedience by actually obeying.

Jesus was not imperfect and then out of his suffering became perfect. There is a perfection that results from actually having suffered; it is different from the perfection that is ready to suffer.
