Guarantor: engyos - A surety.

A "surety " is security against loss or damage. A person who has made himself responsible for another; legally responsible for the debt, default, or delinquency of another.


Jesus "guarantees to men that God will fulfill His covenant of forgiveness, and He guarantees to God that those who are in Him are acceptable."
