1. Grace and Judgment

The story of Esau and Edom – vv. 2 & 3

God deals with us as individuals and as groups (nations/tribes) – Esau and Edom – Jacob and Israel – you and your family – me and you and the U.S. God deals with us as individuals and as groups (nations/tribes) – Esau and Edom – Jacob and Israel – you and your family – me and you and the U.S.

The individual takes precedent over the group – see Ezekiel 18

Ezekiel 18:2-4 "What do you people mean by quoting this proverb about the land of Israel: 'The parents eat sour grapes, and the children's teeth are set on edge'?

3 "As surely as I live, declares the Sovereign Lord, you will no longer quote this proverb in Israel. 4 For everyone belongs to me, the parent as well as the child - both alike belong to me. The one who sins is the one who will die."

32 "For I take no pleasure in the death of anyone, declares the Sovereign Lord. Repent and live!"

Esau

- Surrounded by a family of faith
- Rejected his birthright within that family – chose the flesh over faith
- Rejected his family by who he married
- Lived his whole life under God's good and patient blessings – in proximity to the promises of faith

Esau

Never repented and turned to God

Edom

- Enjoyed God's favor and blessing Gen. 36; Deut. 2
- Threatening to Israel Numbers 20
 - Conquered by David 2 Sam. 8
- Hardened hatred; mortal enemies Obad. 1

Obadiah 1

10 Because of the violence against your brother Jacob, you will be covered with shame; you will be destroyed forever. Grace and salvation is available to every individual – regardless of what his/her group, tribe or family history has been

2. All Rebellions are Doomed - vv. 4 & 5

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Self-sufficiency/self-determination = the ultimate rebellion

A commitment to self-determination inevitably puts us at odds with God and His purposes – it ultimately makes us God's enemies.

We throw away His provision and blessing – the birthright

Self-reliance vs. individual responsibility under God

Then we end up in outright rebellion against Him

Repentance = our way out – salvation

Repentance is available to everyone and is everyone's opportunity to find life
