Mark 2:23 - 3:12

Jesus Matthew 7

24 "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. 25 The rain came down, the streams rose, and the ...

... winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock. 26 But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on sand. ...

... 27 The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell with a great crash."

Legalism and self-righteousness = DEATH

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Spirit and Love – as understood, defined and experienced in Jesus = LIFE

Holding to the letter of the law (word), while missing the spirit of the law leads us to become grotesque hypocrites and hard-hearted enemies of the Law-Giver Himself.

Remember Matthew 9:13 "But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice'...."

2 Corinthians 3:6

"He has made us competent as ministers of a new covenant—not of the letter but of the Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life."

"But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it - not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do."

Jesus is both the ultimate communication (word, law) from God, but also the authoritative interpretation of every other communication of God. – 2:28

He is the decoder ring and the rosetta stone

John 5:22

For not even the Father judges anyone, but He has given all judgment to the Son,

v. 27 - and He gave Him authority to execute judgment, because He is the Son of Man.

Luke 23:12
