Proverbs 3:3

"Let love and faithfulness never leave you; bind them around your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart."

Love, "always perseveres. Love never fails." 1 Cor. 13:7,8

Exodus 34:6,7

"The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, 7 maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin.

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Every horizontal relationship is ultimately about the vertical. How we are with each other is an accurate diagnostic of how we view and feel about God. – v.10
