Wise Words

1. The Power of Wise Words

Discuss:

- Proverbs 15:1 says a soft answer turns away wrath. Why do you think tone can be just as powerful as the words themselves?
- Proverbs 21:23 teaches that guarding our tongue can keep us out of trouble. What practical habits could help us pause before we speak?
- Jesus said in Matthew 12:36 we'll give an account for every careless word. How does that reality change the way we speak in everyday situations—like texting, posting online, or casual conversations?

2. The Potential of Wise Words

Discuss:

- Proverbs 15:28 says the righteous "ponders how to answer." Why is pausing before we respond often harder than it sounds?
- Proverbs 25:11 compares timely words to "apples of gold in a setting of silver." Can you think of a moment when someone's well-timed words made a big difference for you?
- If you had to pick one area to grow in—being more compassionate, more thoughtful, more timely, or more humble with your words—what would it be and why?

3. The Possibility of Wise Words

Discuss:

- James 1:19 calls us to be "quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger." Which of those three do you find the hardest, and what makes it challenging?
- Proverbs 16:23 connects the wisdom of the heart with persuasive speech. How can what's in our heart spill over into our words in positive—or negative—ways?
- Proverbs 18:13 warns against answering before hearing. What's one practice that could help us listen more deeply before responding?
