

DISCUSSION GUIDE

Part 2 of Sunday School

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God revealed as the One who judges sin, preserves the faithful, and provides hope and restoration through His covenant promises.

1. A World of Corruption (*Genesis 6:5*)

- Humanity had become consumed by wickedness, and every intention of the human heart was continually bent toward evil.

Discuss:

- What does this passage teach us about the seriousness of sin and its impact on the world?
- How do you see the effects of sin in our culture and in your own life?

2. A Plan of Cleansing (*Genesis 6:6–7*)

- God responded to humanity's corruption with judgment, revealing both His holiness and His grief over sin.

Discuss:

- How can understanding God's holiness deepen our appreciation for His grace?
- Why is it important to remember that God is both loving and just?

3. A Man of Character (*Genesis 6:8–9*)

- While the world around him was corrupt, Noah found favor with God because he walked faithfully with Him.

Discuss:

- How can we remain faithful to God when the culture around us moves in a different direction?
- What does it practically look like to "walk with God" in your current season of life?

4. A God of Commitment (*Genesis 6:18; 6:22; 7:16; Revelation 3:7*)

- God established a covenant with Noah, provided a way of salvation through the ark, and faithfully carried out His promises.

Discuss:

- What does God's commitment to Noah reveal about His character?



- How does knowing God is faithful to His promises strengthen your faith during uncertain seasons?

5. A Bird of Confirmation (*Genesis 8:6-11; John 1:32*)

- The dove returned with evidence that the floodwaters were receding, confirming that God was bringing Noah into a new season. Throughout Scripture, the dove also points to the work and presence of the Holy Spirit.

Discuss:

- Why do you think Noah patiently waited for confirmation before moving forward?
- Have you ever experienced God giving reassurance or direction during a season of waiting?
