Even though there is consequences for our sin, we can still be forgiven of it. How does someone seek forgiveness from God for their sins?

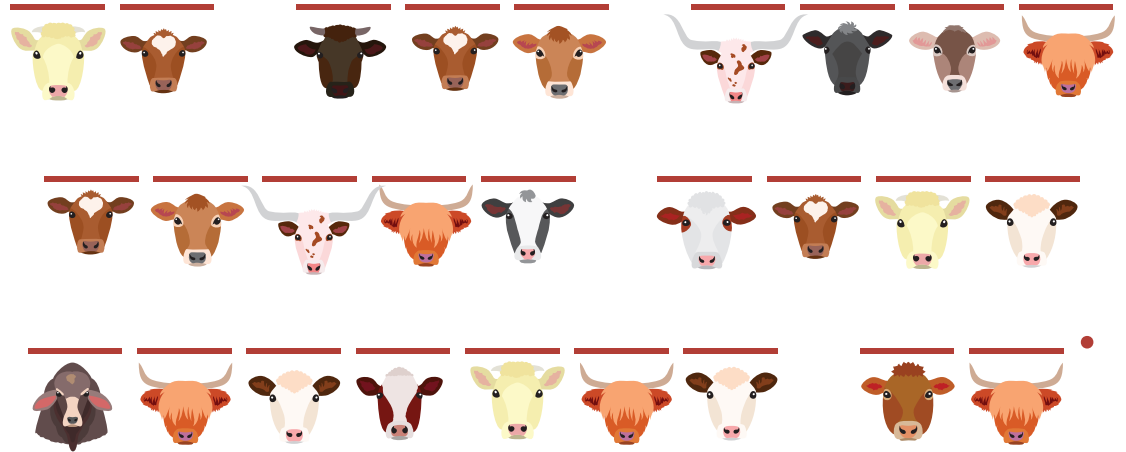
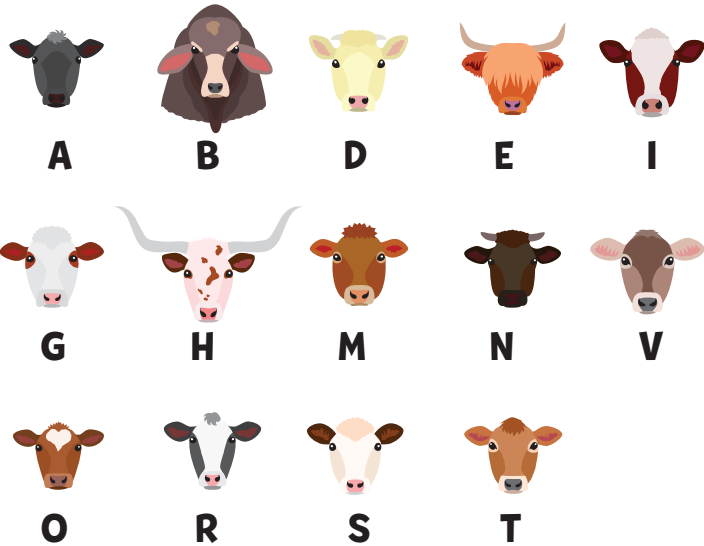
We must worship God and Him alone. What ways can you continue to make sure you worship Him and nothing else?
