The Trinity is an often-misunderstood characteristic of God, especially when it comes to the Third Person of the Godhead – the Holy Spirit. Some view the Holy Spirit as a third god. Others, a force instead of a person. In this series, we will discuss who He is, what His mission is, and why He can and should be worshipped.

Just as the Holy Spirit gives life to all, He also give new life in regeneration. “Whoa!” you say. New life? Regeneration? If you think those words have great implications, wait until you fix your eyes on the God who does great things!

QUESTIONS

- Recap, first: Who is the Holy Spirit, and why should we care about Him?
- Let’s focus on Romans 8:11 – First, how did the Spirit raise Jesus up from the dead? Why is it important that when regarding this verse we see that 1) the Spirit is God, and 2) that there is only one God?
- Why is it necessary that we be regenerated? How does the Holy Spirit do that?

- This verse goes on to say that the Spirit dwells in you. Explain this indwelling. Why would He even want to do such a thing? Why is it necessary?
- Titus 3:4-6 seems to be a trinitarian passage. First, let's break it down. So, God pours out the Holy Spirit, through Jesus. How does that work? Is this how salvation works?
- So to recap, who saves us, exactly?
- What must I do to be saved?

SPRINGBOARD VERSE

Romans 8:11 ESV If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.

Titus 3:4-6 ESV But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, 5 he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, 6 whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior
