JEZEBEL THE MALICIOUS

In this series, we shied away from naming kings and queens as villains, instead categorizing them simply as "evil kings" or "evil queens." We made an exception with Jezebel because of her conniving and malicious schemes. She was a dark-hearted snake masked by a pretty face who used her influence with King Ahab to carry out horrible acts of violence. God, however, will not be mocked.

QUESTIONS

- Is it good to study the villains of the Bible? What do these people reveal about our own hearts?
- Not many people name their precious baby girls Jezebel in fact, it wasn't until 1980 that the name even made a blip on the screen! Let's learn why this is...
- What was happening in the kingdom at this time?
- Who was Jezebel? She wasn't an Israelite. Was it lawful for Ahab to marry her? (1 Kings 16:31) Why was she so evil? (1 Kings 18:13)
- Explain why Baal worship was so evil, and why Jezebel's promotion of this religion was so insidious. Why was this worship so appealing that the Israelites would be snared into its trappings.
- Other than killing God's prophets, two other atrocities were committed by Jezebel the chasing after Elijah after the Mt Carmel incident, and the siege of Naboth's Vineyard. Let's discuss.

- Finally, Jezebel gets justice she deserved. (2 Kings 9:30) Let's discuss the significance of her death.
- What lessons can we learn from Jezebel? Does this reveal anything about God's character?
